3rd February

### The Secret in Their Eyes (18)

Dir. Juan José Campanella. Spain/Argentina 2009. (129m)

Winner of the Best Foreign Film award at the 2010 Oscars, this stylish drama is an intense thriller blending romance, crime drama and history, centring on an unsolved murder in 1970s Argentina.

17th February

### Séraphine (PG)

Dir. Martin Provost. France/Belgium 2008. (126m)

Provost's absorbing cinematic portrait of artist Séraphine de Senlis won seven prestigious Césars. In 1905, 41-year-old self-taught artist Séraphine is working as a housekeeper. When art critic Wilhelm Uhde discovers her secret artwork, an unexpected relationship develops and Séraphine's work gains international attention.

3rd March

### Bad Lieutenant Port of Call: New Orleans (18)

Dir. Werner Herzog. USA 2009. (122m)

Inimitable director Werner Herzog returns with his own special take on film noir. Nicholas Cage plays a rogue detective who, in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, becomes a high-functioning addict, reigning over the ruins of New Orleans.

17th March

### Tricks (12A)

Dir. Andrzej Jakimowski. Poland 2007. (96m)

A young boy in a Polish town attempts to manipulate fate to bring the stranger he believes is his errant father back to the family roost. It's a film full of brilliant humour about cars, women and love. It's also about how to challenge destiny.

31st March

### Departures (12A)

Dir. Takita Yojiro. Japan 2008. (130m)

After losing his job, Daigo returns to his hometown to pick up the pieces of his life. A misinterpreted job advert takes Daigo and the

audience on a sensitive, emotional and often funny journey as he re-evaluates the meaning of life and death.

14th April

### Revanche (15)

Dir. Götz Spielmann. Austria 2008. (121m)

This multi-award winner is a suspense-laden thriller that tells the tragic story of Alex, an ex-con and his prostitute girlfriend Tamara whose hopes of a happy future come to an abrupt end following a bungled robbery.

28th April

### The Maid (15)

Dir. Sebastián Silva. Chile/Mexico 2009. (96m)

Raquel has been working as a live-in maid with the Valdes family for 23 years. When the family hires new staff to assist Raquel in her work, she feels slighted and slyly sabotages their positions.

12th May

### Loose Cannons (12A)

Dir. Ferzan Özpetek. Italy 2010. (110m)

Warm comedy about the problems faced by two gay brothers in a traditional southern Italian family trying to tell their family of their sexuality.

26th May

### Mother (15)

Dir. Bong Joon-ho. South Korea 2009. (129m)

This dark, sensitive Korean thriller from Bong Joon-ho follows a mother's lonely and determined struggle to clear her mentally challenged son when he is implicated in the murder of a schoolgirl.

9th June

### Made in Dagenham (15)

Dir. Nigel Cole. UK/Ireland 2010. (113m)

Dagenham, 1968. In the Ford factory the male workers' conditions far exceed those of their female co-workers. Their reclassification as 'unskilled' workers is the final straw and the women go on strike. A comic portrayal of difficult times that continues to resonate in 2010.
